

## Mental Health Crisis Support: Covid-19 School Closure

Mental Health Emergency	Suspected Child Abuse
If a student is experiencing a mental health crisis and needing immediate emergency support, contact 9-1-1.	ALL KIPPSC staff are Mandated Reporters.
Notify your School Counselor or Mental Health & Support Services Team Manager if a 9-1-1 call is made so appropriate follow up and support can be arranged.	If child abuse is suspected, it is not the job of KIPPSC staff to investigate, but rather, to report it. It is the responsibility of the KIPPSC staff who suspects abuse or receives a report of abuse from a child or parent to make the report to DCFS/CPS.

## **Non-Emergent Mental Health Support**
